ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

St. Luke's Lutheran School's lower school program provides a strong academic foundation. Primary students (grades K-5) develop literary skills through a phonics-based reading program that emphasizes quality literature, reading comprehension, writing, spelling, and grammar. Fourth and fifth grade students continue to study the classics of children's literature through novels, short stories, and poetry. The language arts curriculum also includes writing, grammar, and spelling. Our math program includes hands-on, active learning activities that encourage mathematical thinking and strong computational skills.

All students study earth, physical, and life science topics through text and laboratory-based activities. Children are taught to see God's work in every aspect of His creation. The social studies curriculum covers current events, world culture, geography, and American history. The goal is to encourage an interest in world missions and contemporary culture that will prepare students to impact the world for Christ.

MIDDLE SCHOOL

The middle school years are a time for intense preparation for high school. In addition to the core academic classes, the students can choose from a wide variety of electives and after school opportunities as they begin to discover their interests, gifts and talents. Field trips, community service, and class activities enrich the day-to-day experience of the students.
